

the Creek Nation of Indians many of our citizens holding northern proclivities becoming dissatisfied and went north therefore be it resolved that the property of all such persons are hereby de-claimed(sic) confiscated.

135. Be it enacted that the property of all citizens of the Creek Nation leaving and joining the Federal Government is hereby confiscated and shall be sold and the proceeds of such sales(sic) be put into the National Treasury.

136. Be it enacted That much of the property belonging to citizens gone north have been collected by the officers of the Nation with heavy expenses and much trouble. Therefore no person or persons who may have returned after going north shall have any claim to property as disposed of by the proper authorities of this Nation.

137. Be it enacted that any person going north with O-pothle-yohola or may hereafter go on account of northern proclivities having property and leaving children in the nation, the children so left shall inherit or receive one third of his or their property, but only in cases where such children had not previously received affects from such parents. However the above law shall not be construed to include grandchildren.

138. Be it further enacted That where there are debts against such persons gone north, such debts shall be liquidated out of the remaining two thirds of his or their effects.

139. Be it enacted That should any person of the Hopo-e-
