

157. Therefore be it enacted that the said F. B. Severs is now a full citizen of the Creek Nation and entitled to all the privileges as provided for in such cases by the late Treaty concluded with the Confederate States.

158. Be it enacted that all Traders within the limits of our country who are here by virtue of former licens(sic) are hereby notified to cease as such.

159. Be it enacted that all licened(sic) Traders in the Creek Nation are hereby notified to come forward and settle without delay.

160. Be it enacted By the General Council that if any person of the Creek Nation be found guilty of setting fire to ^{or} burning a House belonging to any other citizen of the Creek Nation upon conviction thereof shall receive one hundred lashes and pay the owner such damages as may be assessed by two disinterested persons and for the second offence shall suffer death.

At a Council held at Scotts on the 8th day of February 1865 Col Chilly McIntosh having withdrawn from the appointment of selecting a Cotton Agent the committy(sic) were directed to take such action as should seem best to them they adopted the report of the Council made at last General Council Jan 13-1865 with the exception of incerting(sic) in the report the name of Capt. James M. C. Smith as a suitable person to select a Cotton Agent instead of Col Chilly McIntosh.
