able body see fit - it would be well for you to pass a law providing for the infliction of a fine or tax, sufficiently heavy to prevent such trespass.

Our laws provide for a tax of one hundred dollars per annum upon all licensed traders doing business within the limits of our Nation, but no provision is made for taxing percons carrying on such kinds of business as can not be classed as common or general trading. The result is that many noncitizens are now doing business, within the Nation, - such as keeping livery stables, saddlery shops, dealing in hides &c and yet no tax is laid upon them. It would be well if some provision could be made to cover such cases.

Many of our citizens have lately grown into the habit of renting improvements or places without improvements to non-citizens. These non citizens after having possession of the places for a short time add other improvements and finally begin to consider themselves owners of both the land and improvements. Complaints of such action are continually coming into this office. It is recommended that some action be taken by you which will remedy this evil.

Our law provides that in cases of emergency, the judge of one district can call upon the light-horsemen of other districts to assist his light-horsemen in making arrests &c.
