AN ACT
FOR THE RELIEF OF THOS. W. HUNTER.

WHEREAS, The passage and approval of an act entitled "An Act for the repairs of Armstrong Academy" carrying with it an appropriation of one thousand dollars, (\$1000.00), having proven to ^{be} wholly inadequate and that Thomas W. Hunter, the then ^Superintendent of Armstrong Academy, did actually spend individual money to the amount of two hundred and forty-eight ^{dollars} and sixty-five cents over and above the appropriation, and that this amount was necessary for the completion of the aforesaid repairs, THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL COUNCIL OF THE CHOCTAW NATION ASSEMBLED,

SECTION 1. That the aforesaid sum of two hundred and forty-eight dollars and sixty-five cents be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the school fund in the sub-treasury of the United States for the relief of the aforesaid Thos. W. Hunter, and this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Sec. I

~~Be it further enacted, That the National Auditor shall issue his warrant for the above amount, and the Treasury shall pay the same. And that this~~
