So, they had to get another job. They worked for Union over there for a long time. They pay pretty good though, that Union.

(Union Oil Co.?)

No. Union Construction.

(Oh, un-huh.)

My brother-in-law that went down there they couldn't get on at the Chemical Co. They wasn't hiring. They kept me over there until I got hurt. Those other boys had a good job with Union Construction. That was outside. We worked on the inside. That was pretty good.

(Well now did you get hurt lifting something heavy?)

Un-humnn--Yeah.

(And pull kidney? Or injured your leg?)

Yeah, I was lifting they called a shoot--it's about 75 lbs. Something like that, 75-80 lbs.

(Un-huh)

Pretty good size. It's about that broad and about that deep I guess. About seven feet long. Nobody didn't help me and I was out there by myself and I tried to hang it up like it should been done. I hung it up alright, but I hurt myself.

MEANING OF O.C.C.O. - MORE ABOUT LANGUAGE BARRIER

(Mr. Guess, I notice that sometimes I see you over in the O.C.C.O. office, are you helping them now with their paper or something?)

O.C.C.O. stands for <u>ORIGINAL CHEROKEE COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION</u>. Yes. Write Cherokee. Translate, if it's not too much. If it's a short one, I do.

(Oh you write Cherokee and English, fluently?)

Well I can write in English a little bit.

(Well that's good. And also do you work as an interpreter sometimes?)
