Well, that could include all the tribes too, because there's a lot of people--friends that I went to school with that I think about a lot, but I don't know where they are at and they all know me by the name of Lucy Logan, and maybe sometime they could pray for me. Different tribes all over the United States--whoever hears this tape--I pray for all of them. So we don't have another one until next year, so that I--well, there's one other thing that I--there's a lot of things that I could tell, you know, tell, but I just--it takes too much time and I don't have time. I have to go to work. (laughs)
