GRANDFATHER GOES TO WASHINGTON AND MEETS JUDGE FRANKFURTER

Well, this what I'm about to tell now, in regard to my late grandfather, Chief Lone Wolf. The time he went to Washington, and was delegated by his Kiowa people to speed up the case of the land that is to be acquired by the white people after the allotment. And he told me that when - and I can just barely remember him when he cam back from that assignment that was given by the Kiowa people. And, and he says when I got to Washington - he talked to me in Kiowa, and that is the reason that I remember that very clearly. Although I was very young I always had respect for my grandfather, because he was my grandfather, not because he was chief, you might look at it that way. But I always listen to him and I'm glad that I did, and that is the reason that I've acquired alot of things that has been taught to me by him. And it gives me those things, as I go back to the days that I stayed with my grandparents. I was raised by them, my grandfather and grandmother. And he told me this incident that happened in Washington in the Supreme Court. That was the time that he, you might say, he locked horns with Judge Frankfurter on a decision. Judge had told him that, "Chief, you have got to start this procedure the way it's suppose to be started." Well, presumably it kinda touched grandpa in a way that wasn't very adapted to, and he told the judge, "I will see you, White Man, pretty soon." Me go back, me see you pretty soon." That's just the exact words he told me he said to the judge. And when he came back, and you know that time the transportation was slow, we didn't have no airplanes like we do in our times now. He had to catch a train to come back
