And then I don't know what happened, anyway he didn't have a sponsor for awhile and now he's got some eldefly woman, I believe is from Pennsylvania and she writes, to him pretty often but they word let us know the'address's of these people that sponsor them. And for sure we don th know how much money they really send. If they do get' a letter from the ir sponsor they usually block out the address: and just leave the name of the sponsor on there.
(I worter why they do that?)
I don't know. I told my little boy one day, I said, "Well, you should send her a thank you card or write her a letter" and he said, "Weli,' I don't have her address" and I guess he must have gone back to school and asked his teachex: and she said well you write her a letter and I'll take it back with me and send it to Mr. Pickard.

And I guess he has to approve the letter or something.
(That might be because they don't want the kids writing and telling everyching.) That may be. Un-huh.
