I think the latest I heard they were going to have it.

(They were?)

Now, I'm not too sure about that but I think I read that either in the paper or some kind of news letter that they were going to teach it.

(I think things of that nature is sort of a start, don't you?)

Un-huh, I do too. I think if it could start up there that maybe the Cherokees could get one started. And I don't know if Catherine told you about it or not the Washington people are coming to Stillwell.

(I heard it mentioned but then somebody said they didn't know if it was true or not. So?)

Well, they're trying to get, to get one started somewhere but I don't know when it will be, or where it will be.

MORE ABOUT NEED FOR MORE INDIAN TEACHERS

(Is that the investigating team for Indian Education? I mean that follow up on it?)

I think so. It probably is. I know they're trying to get this bi-lingual school started at Northeastern this summer so that, you know, that Indian girls can volunteer to teach.

(The ones that are going to be teachers?)

Un-huh, to help the teachers.

(Well, they're finally getting around to it, huh?)

Yeah, I hope it works out.

(Now that you know Cherokee's a foreign language?)

Yeah! Now that I know Cherokee's a foreign language. (Laughter)
(he's really kidding, huh?)
