They were killed right over there, right over at that bluff.

(They were moccasin?)

Yeah, there's lots of them, I guess. I don't bother with them. I killed one last summer right there by the church, about that long. It was the first one I've ever seen around here. And where it came from, I had a bench out there and some of my grandchildren come from New Orleans and their family was here. (static)

(The Yokum Mill.)

The Yokum Mill. Earnest Yokum, he called it E. Yokum Lumber Company.

(Yeah.)

Yokum and Jones at that time.

(Uh-hum.)

He come down from around Grove.

(I guess, there was real fine timber in those days, I guess.)

Oh, yeah, it was fine timber, the best--not like we have now. (words not clear) Yokum, they had a sawmill over here where that store is.

(Yes, sir.)

And back in them days, they made automobile (word not clear) -- you know, when the old cars had (word not clear). They made (word not clear) for them.

(Huh.)
