(Participant, lady:) Got plenty of water, just take some of those pipes laying out on the road.

Mr. Clement: Maybe we got one of these Department of Agricultural water systems running through that country and town?

(Participant, man:) No.

(Participant, man:) And it isn't heavily enough populated to hardly support one.

Mr. Clement: One or two houses a mile can't support a water system. Well, there's some kind of program of the Department of Agriculture. They have. (Participant, man:) Well there's several other states over the country other than Oklahoma that's usually somewhat heavier populated where there's (not clear) how many units are there per people out there.

Mr. Clement: Right around twenty units.

(Participant, lady!) All ready.

(Participant, man :) Well about a mile south there at that fruitstand (not clear) About a mile south of there. Seems like it just tapers off right over that hill there.

(Participant, man:) You see I can show you, I have the documents there in the (not clear) office that those (not clear). Why there's water there and why there isn't any water down the hill. Or over the hill east.

(Participant, lady:) Well how about that place right across the road from it.

Isn't there much water there?

(Participant, man:) You mean at (not clear) right across the highway?

(Participant, lady) Just right across there and that s...looks like he has supply. water supply.

(Participant, man:) No, down in that valley that could be some surface water. See those, see those, there is some wells down in that flat valley
