

and royalties and cash amounting to about \$500 million over the next ten years. And the big question is how to govern the Indians, Aleuts and Eskimos who are supposed to benefit from this money, and should we govern them to give them maximum good (inaudible). Senator Gravel takes the position that we should give it to them, no strings attached, to do with the money whatever they want; it is their money and that the BIA or federal government should not try to take a protective or paternalistic position but rather let the Indians and Eskimos do what they want with these funds.
