Cherokees. Yeah, there was old man Holland Manuel Holland, Matt Sanders. They was Indians, Cherokee Indians. Andy Lowrey, he was Cherokee Indian. Luke Davis, he was a Cherokee Indian. George Woodward, he was Cherokee Indian, and, oh, there was lot of Cherokee Indian people here. All of them was Cherokee. Now, there was Mort Wallace, Cicero Johnson, old man Moore, they was white men, but they married Indian woman. George Anderson, he married an Indian woman. He was white man. He come from Georgia here. (Yeah.)

And his wife was kin to them Gullagers.

(Clu Gullager, lived over at Muskogee.)

Chris Gullager, Mary Gullager, I knew Mary. I knew all of them. They lived there. Old man Gullager, he was Englishman, but his wife was Indian. And she was a sister to George Anderson's wife.

(Yeah.)

And Mrs. Addison, she was a sister to both of them, and to this Julia and George Anderson's wife too. They're all three sisters. And they all kin folks.

SMALL FARMS - LIVE STOCK FOR LIVELIHOOD

(How did people make a living down in there? With cattle and hogs?)

They had mostly cattle and hogs, horses and farms. My daddy used to buy cattle. He talked Cherokee and English both. One time, we were living there at Park Hill then.

(Yeah.)

FATHER WAS A SUCCESSFUL CATTLE BUYER

Lawas just a little boy. One evening, me and my mother was there. My two o'lder sisters was going to school at the seminary over there. Living there, the girls went to school. They was over there going to school. My daddy
