They'd be my grandpa. And I would give his name, Aching Legs--

(If you're talking to him?)

Yeah. He's part Comanche. Same way with Grandpa Little Raven--I call Little Raven "grandpa."

(Going back to your father's father--what would you call him?)

Just like I was calling my grandpa.

(Would you say that one again?)
