Well, I regret it this day that I done that. Well, we cannot solve this poverty as long as this world is standing, this we know. We may solve some of the problems, but we cannot solve all of them 'cause I have been witnessing all these things you know at Hulbert, around the community, around the surrounding towns and upon these small boys, say fourteen to fifteen-sixteen year olds now they have problems at home, just like my problems. Now modern stuff that we have is drives 'em that way, I think, now such as automobiles, motorcycle, and stuff that is fast moving, I would call it. Back in my days, they were not fast moving, we had to walk to see what was on the other side of that hill, so right today, these high school dropouts, they want to go and make it on their own, which they don't realize they're doing it wrong. Now, I have been a witness to that, taking an example on my life when I say these things. Now I regret it this day and night that I didn't take advantage of the education that was right on my hand them days and would urge all these high school boys, Indians, whites, and the negroes to get their educations.
