(Yeah.)

Third man's voice: Well, my dad could cure that. But he'd make 'em drink water out of a shoe.

Shore 'nough'.

Third man's voice: Yeah. Don't know what else he did, but he anyway they drank water from the shoe.

And I'll tell you one remedy the doctor can't do nothing with. That's what they call-wait a minute -- shingles.

(Shingles. Well, my -- )

Doctor can't do nothing with that. (Static) They claim if they go clear around 'em it will kill 'em.

Third man's voice: What they claim. And the doctors the way they doctor they just give people shots. They don't do no good.

(No.)

Third man's voice: You've got a good yard light here, haven't you?.

(Tape skip.)

(And I never did find anywhere about the Cherokee jewelry.)

This here white man lives right here. His wife is a Creek. Yeah.

(I know the Cherokees. Sometimes they would wear one small eagle feather in their hat band. But outside of that they never went in for jewelry.

The women didn't go in for necklace or things like that.)

That's right.
