BRIEF INTRODUCTION

(June 23, 1969. Today I'm visiting with Emmet Lowrey, a 73-year old Cherokee of Stigler, Oklahoma. Mr. Lowrey talks about his native Briartown country and of the many peoples and events of interest that he has known.)

(First of tape skips too much to be clear)

BRIARTOWN AND PEOPLE WHO LIVED THERE

(Yeah, I've read of Sam Starr.)

Well, Tom was his father.

(Yeah. And then Tom. Well not that--were they--was he the father of Belle Starr?)

No. Belle Starr was Shirley, you know.

(That's right. Sure.)

But Sam lived with her. He was Tom's son.

(But I was just wondering how old Briartown is?)

Oh, I wouldn't know.

(It must be an old place.)

Well, it was settled right after the Indians come from-through on the Trail of Tears, see. Now they first landed up there on the Illinois River.

(Yeah.)

That was the first. And then there was a bunch of 'em come on down in here.

Then there was some Indians come up--what did they call them. Did they call them immigrants.

(Yeah)

That came up out of Texas.

(Out of Texas.)

Yeah. Now my grandmother's people came out of Texas.
