(Yeah. I like that country out there.)

Janez, Pueblo is an interesting place because it--I mean the country is interesting because it's pretty much desert south of there. But right at Janez, you know, you get into canyon country and then up into the mountains. And it's really quite beautiful. It's about six thousand feet high. And nice country.

(And you went to high school at Bernalillio?)

Yeah I went to--there two years. And I went to Albuquerque and lived away from home one year to go to high school. And then I graduated from a military school in Virginia. I went away to Virginia to school in my senior year. I graduated. Then I went back to the University of New Mexico.

(My that's quite a distance to finish up school.)

Yeah. Then when I got through at the university, I graduated there, I taught for a year on the Jicarilla Apache reservation. And I loved that. That was beautiful country too. That's way up in the northwestern part of the state, great country.

(It sure is. I have some friends at the Taos Pueblo.)
Oh, yeah.

(Uh-huh. My sister used to live out in Albuquerque in towards the University.

You went there too, didn't you?)

Yeah.

(In '35, !36. We met some people from the Taos reservation, Rueblo.)
What were those people's name? Bete Bernard, I don't know whether you know him, or not. He's quite old now if he's still living: It's been some time ago when we first got acquainted with him, you know. And he used to come back here, oh, once a year and visit around. But he's got so old now.
