have that—the kind of machine down here, huh? So, why they send you to Fort Smith?)

Oh, there's no telling what they tell you. (Laughter)

Maggie: That makes me mad, them nurse, you know. Somebody is really bad sick, you know, and they just walk around, walk around, you know. He just give me the pills when I was up there, and the next day they x-ray me.

(Irrelevant conversation.)

(Yeah. So how long did you stay in at the hospital, Aunt Suzie?)

I nearly stayed two days, maybe it was three. I don't know.

(Three days?)

Course, it stopped.

(Then they brought you on back home?)

I come home.

(Well. Did they bring you back to Tahlequah in an ambulance?)

No, I come home (inaudible).

(You did yourself?)

No, they brought me, my boys, you know.

(Oh, I see, you brought one of your boys--came and got you.)

Maggie: She's got a big tree behind house, looks good.

(Oh, good shade tree.)

Maggie: Uh-huh, and she's got a---

(Aunt Suzie and Maggie speak in Cherokee for about a minute.)

Maggie: ---I went up there and look at it. (Speaks in Indian language for a couple of sentences.) "Wendy," I said, "You need this?" Said, "Huh-uh, want to get rid of them." (Sentence in Indian language), little ol' cook stove about that big. (Speaks in Indian language for about one minute.) See, they like to cook outside in the old time, you know. That'
