I was born in Lawton at the Public Health Service Indian Hospital in Lawton. In 1946.

(And how many brothers and sisters do you have?)

I have one sister. And two half-sisters and one half-brother.

(And do they still live in Oklahoma?)

Well one does. My brother lives in Oklahoma. My sister lives inone of 'em is living at home. In San Francisco. The other one is in
Alaska right now because this one sister her husband's a military
serviceman. And my real sister is presently living in Lawton. Her
husband is stationed at Fort Sill. Military Post. And in November
he will be leaving to Vietnam. And I guess that will be her home till
he comes back.

(They all marry Indians or did they marry white people?)

No. One of my half-sisters, the next to the older of the half-sisters, she married a Mexican. And my older sister, she married a Pima Indian.

Really I should say Pueblo Indian from Santa Fe area.

(And your half-brother?)

He's married to a White'. White lady. Caucasian.

(An Anglo? Your brother works for OIO?)

Yes, he does.

(What is his name?)

Bill Gover.

EDUCATION AND GRADE SCHOOL EXPERIENCES

(Well, Wallace, I wanted to ask you, too, where did you go to school when you were young and growing up in Lawton?)

Well, in junior high I went to a country school. To a small country school. I don't think we had attendance of 180. This is one of those schools, you know, that didn't have a junior high school. Grade school was between from the first to the eighth grade. Then you transferred to
