The "Birdtails". We've got another boy, Robert Belt, who's Cherokee. (Robert Belt.)

There's a lot of those parts I think that Cherokees could fill. That's another story.

(Yeah.)

I'd be getting off^{*}doing something else. I don't like to talk about it. Because of my part in society.

(Yeah, well, I know what you mean, you probably don't, as long as you're working for them you don't want to say anything that would be derogatory.) Right.

(Right.)

And once I was outside, you know, then I could really blast it.

(Yeah, well Don, you have another brother. How many's in your family?) I've got four brothers and one sister.

(Four brothers and one sister, so really there's seven of you.) Eight, counting my mother and dad. Five boys and "Twieg", she's not really my sister. She's my cousin, but we raised her since she was about 2 or 3 days old.

(She's first cousin?)

Right.

(Well, in Indian families, they consider first cousins brothers and sisters, don't they?)

Right. (Yeah) And she looks, she don't look very much Indian. She's half. (Ooh, "Twieg".) She's half Kiowa. Right.
