Oh, gradually they're cutting it down.

(I understand now, it's just the Freshmen?)

Uh-hmmm.

(Is it just the Freshmen now that have the grants? The grants and the loans, or is it Freshmen and Sophomores?)

No, I'm not too familiar with it here recently.' I hadn't had any contactwith it in about a year. But once you get up to be a Junior or Senior or upper-classman, they work with you the best they could to get you out. (Uh-huh.)
