And there was—it just seem like to me there was lot of trees, tall trees all around it. And I don't know where Mr. Wolf came from, but he had the children there. And they just took care of 'em like. I think he was a missionary and it was sorta supported by some board.

(Yes, ma'am. Was he an Indian or white man?)

I think he was a white man.

(Yeah.)

His wife was Cherokee. She was a Timberlake. Kate Timberlake. (What was her first name?)

Kate.

(Kate.)

Katherine, I think, her name was, but they called her Kate. Kate

Timberlake. She was Cherokee. And after his death, why—well, you
know this junior high school right up here where they used—it's on

The side of the Worcester Academy. Let's see. It was in that same
block across the street at the north end of that block. The house
is still standing there. Now that's where Timberlakes lived. And

Mrs. Wolf lived there after her husband's death. It seems like there's
some inscription on the sidewalk there. Isn't there Ellen?

/second female voice: You know, I've forgotten. I don't know./

It just seems like there was something. Some inscription, maybe—
/second female: Seem like there was, but I don't remember what it is./

(Yeah. Did you ever hear—I imagine he was Reverend Wolf—what his
first name was?)

Do you remember Ellen?

/second voice: No, I don't. Who was Honey Creek?/
