AGE

(How old are you getting to be now?)

Well, I had a birthday the seventh--nineteenth of this month.

And if they told me right, I'm eighty-three.

(Eight-three. Well, you've lived lot longer than most folks.)
Yes, that's right.

MURPHY COMMUNITY

(Well; you saw this country over here then before they got it all torn up then, when it was good farming in there.)

Well, I had one of the best farming countries that our country ever saw.

(What became of all the poor Indians?)

Indians?

'(Yeah. There used to be a lot of Indians over here.)

Oh, they all gone now.

(All gone.)

All gone.

(Yeah, the Adairs and all that *Markhams.)

Markhams, yeah.

(All gone now.)

Yes sir, all gone,

(Yeah, that river bottom, I guess, had some good farms in it one time.)
