Used to be what they call Kiowa school. It's gone now, but that's the way it happened. And Hicks (Boyiddle) might know that story.

(Were they trying to get back to their camp?)

Yea, and they didn't make it. They just had about a mile to go, I guess. That's the way my father used to tell it.

/(Where was that?)

South of Zodlton, about two miles. Yea there's a mountain here, and there's another mountain, that's where they were camping, on the other side. And those boys froze around this other mountain. Cause my brothers used to like to get out and walk in the night when it was cold, and they tell us that story. I don't know how many times they told us that story. Use to scare them boys. Yea, Uncle Hicks probably know who that Apache man was, cause Daddy used to say he was buried on that hill. Medicine Nan, but he never did say. The called his name, but I don't remember. And he told Ray that too. He told Ray that night, you ought to go up there, lay up there on night, you might learn something. Apache man buried over there, medicine man. Ray said, I'm not going over there. You know where I said that creek runs between them two mountains, well it's back south. There's a little hill there, on the east side of the road.

(Several minutes of irrelevant conversation.)

COMMENTS ABOUT ANOTHER SPRING

Ray: There's another "Zodlton" here. Did I take you down there?

Straight south of here, about a mile and a half. Got a big lake over

there. On that spring. That one smell just like Zodlton, and they use
