(Where do you go to Clinic?)

Shawnee Clinic.

(Do you think Indians have good white doctors?)

No, I don't think so 'cause they are always changing doctors. When one gets use to--to my sickness and give me good medicine, another would come along and tell me I don't need the medicine and give me different kind. Some times, some don't know too much. It's either the one left or the new doctor 'cause they never agree on same medicine. One doctor said I didn't need them medicine.

(How often do they change them doctors around?)

Six month, year or something.

(How many different doctors have seen you here lately?)

This year I had about three different ones. I get check about four times and all different one.

(A new doctor huh?)

They keep asking me questions and when one gets use to me, another different doctor comes and too many questions asked about my health.

(Do you wonder why they do that?)

I've heard some say they are just practicing on Indians. After they train on us, I hear they go in to Army doctors, after they get good. About 5 years ago, there was Dr. Bardie (?) and he was good, but I heard he was army doctor now.
