and School. Mrs. Mary Ironside brought a pair of high button shoes that the women wore back in the 1890s. Mrs. Bob Armstrong brought a shawl that her mother had made and worn in the 1880s. Mrs. Mary Hannah brought some old pictures of the 1890s showing different families and gatherings of people of that time. General discussions and visiting by all took over for a few minutes. Order was restored and the group sang "Rock of Ages". All then stood to repeat the Lord's Prayer.

The long serving table was brought out from the side wall and assembled.

A cover was spread and the table was piled high with all kinds of food.

A more friendly group of Indians, or a more bountiful feast, would be hard to find today. Not only does this community work to preserve a heritage, a close association of friendship and neighborliness, and a way of life, but a welcome is extended to all to share in their blessings.
