And half of them died enroute to Kansas. They brought them to Ottawa, Kansas. So Ottawa, Kansas, the Ottawa tribe combined with the Quakers, they founded Ottawa University at Ottawa, Kansas. I'll say about four or five years ago this tribal chief, Clarence King, and I and his son we went to Mayetta to the Pow-wow. We stopped at that University. And seems like they already knew about this tribal chief, Clarence King.

(Well.)

So it was a great honor to them at Ottawa University for them to have a tribal chief visit there.

(Yeah. How big an area did that government have for the Ottawas down here in Oklahoma?)

Well, wasn't too much. Wasn't too much of an area. I would say -- couldn't have been over ten, fifteen thousand acres.

(Well.)

See, well you take the Ottawa reservation, runs from Miami east and then south. So it was all made into allotments.

(Yeah.)

And allotments were made back about 1890.

SENECA INDIAN SCHOOL ESTABLISHED BY QUAKERS

Then the Quakers they came into Wyandotte. And they founded this Seneca Indian Training School.

(Yeah.)

And they had their centennial, hundred anniversary of the Seneca Indian Training School last, I think it was last August.

(Uh-huh.)

So the name's Quaker, that's where we derive our English name from. His
