Page, 6 'I can't think. (Yeah) (Not clear) (Yeah) That's where I was raised. (That's where you was raised. That's where that Hawkins fella was buried.) Uh-huh. . (Not clear) (Yeah) (Not clear) (Well, he was an old Indian, huh?) Yeah. (Not clear) made the Cherokee Alphabet. (Yeah) He wrote me from California. He was raised around Peggs. He knows me Cherokee writing. He told me that Sequoyah died in Mexico. (Yeah) And they give him 500 acres of land. Give it to him and there was about 100 Cherokees on there. Them Mexicans they just give . 'em that land, you-know. Yeah) On each corner--he found a cornerstone--cornerstone where the land was. Those 500 acres Sequeyah had. (Not clear) 500 acres. They lived on that land. He said he wanted to find his grave. (Yeah)

Said if I find his grave I'm going to have it dug up and bring it to Tahlequah where them--tombstone. That's what he was looking for. He
