(Yeah.)

And that was something that never happened back there. And them eats these young rabbits up over in there. They kill 'em out. (words not clear.)

No, you can't. I went two or three times last year just -- I went more for exercise. Well, I'm about to kill a rabbit. Wife, there, she'd rather eat a rabbit as to eat a chicken. She---

(I had. I like 'em.)

She likes the wild rabbit. And but—I like to go for exercise, but I didn't find any, not a one.
