Well, I guess there's a lot of things we could talk about, but its getting late
and I enjoyed it and maybe -- )
(Talks in Creek.)
(She's over at her house, reading -- he was reading his Bible. I believe he's
a good preacher. Good man.)
      I believe (talks in Creeck.) Uh-huh. He's all time reading his Bible
and my daddy used to talk to him and (Creek words) -- and I guess that was on his
mind when he came back from work. And I had dreamed of my daddy that night
before. Every one in awhile I dream about my daddy and my mother. (Talks in
Creek.)
(You know that's the way I used to hear my boys calling me. They say "Mom.")
(There is about 5 minutes of tape in Creek that has not been translated.).
(Do you go to church now?)
I ain't been to church quite awhile. I use to go all the time.
(Where's your church?)
At Norbert. (?)
(Oh, um-huh.)
(Mr. Stover is talking in Creek language, but has not been translated.)
(Not the one that's there now?)
No. (More talking in Creek that is not translated.)
(Well, Eli I guess we will go home and let you go to sleep. And I sure thank
you.)
