(Well.)

Start--got off to a pretty good start. Then these three agents got in and bought all the land here by old man Jim McCoy.

(Yeah.)

I got a sale deal on for it when they purchase it. Old man Jim McCoy lives right there back of that white house.

TOWN AND RAILROAD YARD AT WATTS

(Where was the railroad yards and-,-?)

Had'em all over this area by the railroad yard.

(Right down on this flat here then.)

See them concrete down over there?

(Yeah.)

Them's the old time tables.

(Well.)

The round house was just the other side of the turntable.

(Yeah.)

Down just about where that tower is between those two buildings. Two tin buildings. Was the upper end of the coal shoot. They took out most of the old freight track on there.

(Yeah.)

Long switchline over there on the other side. And there was three or four down through there. There completely gone now. And then down through here there must have been some switchs. They're still in.
