(But the women and the men are both fill the whole tipi from the south side to the north side of the door.)

Yes, the door always be east. Well, the women sit way back the men always in front. The fire fight here (In the middle of the tipi) ..in middle. And one be sitting there you know a janitor. He go outside and get some wood, bring it and fix fire. That where he go.

(Was there any kind of a moon like the altar in the peyote meetings?)

No, I didn't see any. Well there could be something like that but not like in the peyote. But this one, they got clay, you might say, and they got fire made. That's the way they had.

(Then there's nothing on the floor at all except the fire in the middle?)

Yea, it's the dirt, all inside, lying in front of men, where they sit.
