

I used to teach. I got bout 300 girls to take care of.

(Did they all live in one building?)

They had 1, 2, 3 big dormitories. Every girl make their own bed, every morning they get up and fix their beds.

(And where did they eat?)

Dining room. Boys eat there too.

(Were there as many girls as boys?)

About the same amount.

(What tribes?)

Kiowa, and I take care of 325 girls. In the mornin after breakfast they come in. I line them up. Give em shoe polish. "Polish your shoes."

I tell them get ready for school. Mornin school. The ones that goes to school in the afternoon, they go to work. I send me all to work.

They got different work to do. Those that goes to school in the mornin they clean up their clothes, change clothes, they all wear the same kind of clothes. They're all in uniforms. Same kind.

(What kind of clothes? The uniforms. Can you remember what they looked like?)

They was grey. Cut something like those. (Indicates a sleeveless jumper which one of the interviewers is wearing.) With a white blouse.

(A kind of pinafore?)

Um-hum.

(What kind of shoes?)

Black shoes. Black top shoes.

(Did they wear socks?)

Stockings. Black stockings. And right at the end they got their names on them. All the clothes of every girl got to have their names on them.
