(That's a beautiful china closet, isn't it?)

That's an old timer.

(It certainly is.)

Oh, I tried to get that.

(I know you were 'cause you're certainly proud of it.)

And years ago a man at the poor house made that for her. You know when they had the poor farm, he whittled that out with his pocket knife.

(Well.)

That's not bad, is it?

(I think that's very good. That's perfect likeness of old time (word not clear))

I'm going to try to fix that like a certain place for it. That's over one hundred years old. He was sixteen years old and fought in the Revolutionary War and that's the original picture taken. That's his Civil War uniform.
