Well, according to after--see all these reservations schools went up to sixth grade. And when you finished the sixth grade, that was equivalent to the Junior High. And then when you went to these non-reservation, that was how they called them, that was Haskell, Chillaco, and Carlyle, and then there was Sherman Institute and Phoenix, Arizona and I think they had one over at (word not understood) Virginia. So you had your choice whenever you finished these lower grades. So, I chose Carlyle due to the fact that I had polio. From what Father Isadore told me that he thought that if I would go to Pennsylvania they probably
