(It's amazing how well the Indians conducted themselves in their way of life, you know, every day life, from their birth until they die.)

Yes, they, I believe, cause the way the old people tell us about their ancestors. You know, it's, they're guided by the Great Sprit, see,

Almighty God. See, when they first came here, why, they were instructed

by this certain man or somebody that brought them here. And he instructed

them how to conduct their lives, and how to live, and how to make these

shelter for themselves, and how to get these what kind of a wood, to use

for tipi poles and all that things and stuff. Well, and this man instructed

them along every line of their life. And moral and everything about their

life. They were instructed, they were guided and lead by someone, see.

See, they didn't went about just like other people they talk about in

Africa and those places. They were guided people. They lived their own

lives, you know. Of course, they were wrong. They're mistaken. Now,

what's going on today, savagery in the universities, you know. I used

to consider them, I used to respect those people. Now, I, things changed,

you know. People, they're different. They're supposed to know better.
