There's lots of them older ones. I'm acquainted with the older ones and they're getting old and they just about died out. (They just about gone.)

And there in just one fellow that I know well we raised together who lives up across the river.

(Xeah.)

And we generally--I telephone and come out and sometimes we go to town and look around.

(In the early days, where did they - the Creek have their meeting house? Or did they have another one besides this one?)

I know, I don't know. I ain't been out that much. Been raised here but been off school before I been San Francisco, California, got a daughter that lives in Los Angeles.

(Ah-hum.)

I got two boys out there. One of them raises horses. I don't know where they make it or not. He stopped along here last month. He told me they was all swelled up.

(Where is the old Creek Indian burial ground?)

I don't know. It's up there at Okmulgee that way.

(Up at Okmulgee.) '

A bunch of Indian laws going on they used kill there you know and they had a regular place to bury-them.

(Up at Okmulgee.)

Yeah at Okmulgee.

(Did the people here, have burial place?) Huh.

(Did the people at the Hitichita have burial ground too?) -No, Just some of them, I've got my own out here.
