Sitting Bull the Arapaho apostle that's his picture given there. I wonder where that..said at the close of the outbreak of the Sioux that's where they came in,

(Do you sing Ghost Dance music too?)

Uhuh, I know the songs.

(Do you like to sing them?)

Yes, I think they're pretty.

(If you want to ;you can sing a Ghost Dance song and we'll have it on tape.

Here it is right here. No, that's uh..Comanche..Arapahoe and all sorts of songs here. (In Mooney's book on the Ghost Dance)..Kiowa Apache..Now, let's see. See that right here. Says so God created man in his own image. I guess that's I don't know what this is, I'd have to study it. This is Mooney's uh, version of the.. where is that Caddo deal? I've forgotten just where the pages are of the songs, cause Doc and I worked it out in Indian and he knows it well. See, these are all Kiowa-Apache songs and Cheyenne-Arapaho. Here they are, all the way through. Now here it is here. See that. You know music, you can pick it out. Since I can read I just go ahead and get that.

(Could you read or sing the Caddo part of that?)

Why sure. Why I could sing it. You got that on now? See, this one goes and 3/4 time moderato.

SINGS A CADDO GHOST DANCE SONG

That's our mother. It refers here to the earth. Ist's songs of the Caddo here.

Different translations. And then the old here ish, see some of these didn't have any music, but we did work out a lot of them. Then this one is (Caddo name).
