Jordan: Now this Lynn Poahy, is he a committeeman for the Kiowas?

Irene: Yes, for this Housing.

Roberta: He's the one that told me to turn my second application in. He said, "Just don't even put your husband down on there," And I felt kinda silly, you know. (others laugh) I just put ours down there and they found out through my old application who I was married to and how much he was making and everything, so it was the same thing. And this way I just thought, "I believe I'll just divorce him and get a home and then remarry him." And then I thought, "Oh, he might not want me back!" (Everyone laughs)

Birdie: Anything to get a home!

Roberta: So I just might be losing out all around. I don't know what to think.

Jordan: Is Spotted Bird a committeeman too?

Irene: He was on that Sanitation. They have terms, running so many years--two or three years, I think, and then they get new ones in there. They're supposed to have a vote on some committeeman--because I know two women are running, aren't they?
