She could get on the jury. She saying personal tax-she's qualified. But they probably won't pick her being Indian. They fold us to pay personal tax.
Roberta: They told us to go turn in our furniture--ice box and stove-msomething of value. . Iike assessor--thet's what it was'.
Irene: It's television, refrigerafor, and hot water tank and a deep freeze if you have it. or electric stove. All she d got on the ete is her refrigerator and television and hot water thenk. Ahd the gas stove don't count. She pays twelve or fourteen dollars a yedr. And then our tax comes around and wè pay sixty dollars a year: We all fine of us inherit that' land so we pay fifteen dollars apjece. That's seventy-five, ssn't it?" Seventy-five dollars a year. Tax. We pay it to the city. And the Agency does that for us. Because it's'restricted lot. ". The old man (Apache Ben) bought it though the Agency with the money he drawed. 'He bpught that lot. And then when the old man died, my mother inherit it., And when my mother died we ail came in on it. All five of us: But I bought fifty by fifty. Which I thought I could buila a home there. Then when I did, I couldn't, because there wasn't no value on it. No lobap value.
Jordan: Haye Sally and Blackie gone back together?
Irene: Yeah. They split the blanket and then Hey went back. Because they didn't have enough money. He got laid' off. He couldn't pay for his rent and feed his family. I think they were three or four months behind on their rent. They paid forty-five dollars a month. I pay their utility bills for them most of the time. But he'd pay me five dollars or three dolars at a time to make up for it. What I didn't get back, I just let it go. We did Eiton the same way:. Try to help. Because we didn't have any rent, to pay. All we pay: is our utility bijlis.'. Then when you don't pay your utility bills, ypu pay an extra three dollars. Because we always be late. We don't have to bed-it's
