it. But they all got the same name. If you have a child, got (not clear) have the second or third child, he gets the name or on down the line. But the only thing, if it's a man, your children have a tirl, they got name too. It's out of our deer clan, but when they get married they don't get deer name, they have to get--go by the other side. Whatever clan he is, their turn to go to that name over there. If he is bear clan, she gets the bear clan name. (Oh, if I had a daughter, and if she married into maybe, let's say, a bear clan, she'd be in the bear clan.) Yeah, in that name.

(Oh-h-h!)

Yeah.

Uh-huh.

They go by what the bear does Bear goes walking in the night time, looking for something to eat: They get name like that. (Her off-spring would be in the bear clan.) Uh-huh.

(But if someone married my son, they would be in the deer clan.) Yeah.

(Just like--just like now who--this is kinda like they don't do it hardly much anymore. They use to have name when you were born.)

(Then when you become a man they have another name?) Hun-hum. That's the same thing. They got name for that too. (Who gives those names?)

Well, an--long time ago, you know the old persons in your clan--old person. Just like I say when have ceremonies where they name you. They go through different ceremonies when they get through, they give you that name. They give_ you that name after you get old, they carry that the rest of their life. (Just like me. I wanted to give my boy a name. He's grown-up now. I get someone from my clan?)
