some dreadful things that happened to me. I could have been this way, that way, but I thank God for sparing my life to this day. And when you think about our people, that's the first thing we think about is, all of our tribes, you know, and especially in Oklahoma cause we're < known pretty heavy tribe here, you know. That's including our western tribes and other tribes that come in, you know, besides the Poncas and Osages and Kaws, Tonkawas, Pawnees, Poncas, Sac and Fox, and Caddos, and Cheyennes, and Arapahoes, Comanches, and Kiowas, and Apaches, (Ponca word). Now we learn to know Indians out west, you know, western part of the United States, different tribes there. We pray every day for our people, you know and just some way; just any way that they may be well, anyway, you know, just keep well. Some day, they might find the truth of God, you know. They always give, God is merciful. Give Him a chance, you know. So, we pray that they may be kept alive for just a little longer, you know, keep well, the Lord may keep His hand on them, keep them well, and help them with (not clear) You know, in recent years, days, I heard that they're trying to abolish the Indian Bureau, and things like that, and kinda schools like here at Chilocco. Started some kind of a little misunderstanding they had. It wasn't in big trouble, but just little misunderstanding they had. But anyway, we prayed for that school too, and from that just ask the Lord to, course, if anything like that happens, you know, lot of our people, course, some of us like you or me, well, we can margage. See, we can manage. See, we can manage this or that way, and they can ask God to help them. There's lot of them are not that way, see? Majority are not that way. But if they should happen like that, well, they go to selling what land they have, what few acres they have. And next morning, you'll find them out in the road, see? And they have to do more than, see? That's what we lose, so we pray that the Bureau will continue to operate, you know, for those kind of people's sake, you know, take care of them.
