Yeah, they give tables over there. And they do over here, now. At Sefling. But, you know, we never did do that. But they got this table giving-away from Montana. I guess that's the way the Montana people gives away. They have tables here all around to give them, and that's where they got it.

(What kind of things would they have at Seiling when they'd have a special—would that be just a benefit dance or what?)

Oh, they always have boys come home, and then a benefit dance, and then these kids that get through with school, they have special for them. And then if they got a kid dancing they have special for them.

ORGANIZATIONS THAT SPONSOR BENEFITS; SERVICE CLUBS

(I was just wondering if there's ever any pow-wows at Seiling?)

No, they don't have no pow-wows. They started to have one and somehow, you know, some of them don't get along. Somebody blowed it up. They had a treasurer to take care of the money and before the time come I guess he had all the money spent. And they didn't get to have it. But they have pow-wow at Watonga.

(What was the organization at Seiling that was going to have it?)

Service Club. They have a Service Club. We had a club of our own, here.

It was my boy's club--"Lewis Howling Buffalo Club," they used to call it.

And just think, all of them is dead but there's just two of us. And this woman's been in the hospital. Just me and Saul Birdshead's wife is left.

And all these women and the men that joined our club are all gone. And there's just two of us left. So, last pow-wow over here (Barefoot), this Bertha Little Coyote got up there and talk. And Kate Osage, her club is all gone. She's just left alone. And she said, "We adopt Myrtle and Kate Osage into our club. They're Gold Star Mothers, and we're going to put them in our club." So I belong over there. I belong at that club.

(That's at Seiling?)
