He lives near Grove, Oklahoma and attends Shawnee Tribal meetings at White Oak. Mr. Shawnee is considered an outstanding singer in northeastern Oklahoma. His son, Jerome Shawnee is head of the Loyal Shawnee Tribal Council at White Oak.
