"Sister-in-law."

(How would you say that?)

nωto'u

(What would she call you?)

Same thing.

(And if you're talking about her to someone else, how would you refer to her?)

Well, nωto'u , same thing.

(And what if she's got a sister and you're talking about both of your sisters-in-law?)

nωto' uh ω'

(Then what about your husband's brother? If he hadn't died young, what would you call him?)

neθ ε bi

(Can you talk directly to him?)

Yes.

(What if you're talking about him to someone else?)

Same thing--ne.θ ε bi

(What if you have more than one brother-in-law?)

neθ ε bihω'

(How did you say "old lady?")

baet ε bihiisei
