And on up till summer vacation days in May we have, well that's the only time I went home, and I've been in school all that time. All the rest of them months until in May, May, June, July and August and then in September we go back. Then that's how I got to school. My mother and my dad didn't have to take me to school. I went to school myself. By going visiting she asked to me stay so I just stayed with her.

(Did you stay at the school?)

Yea, we stay at the school. We don't go nowhere. The girls they got a dormitory of their own and the boys got a dormitory of their own. And we got a dining and a kitchen and a bakery combined together. That's where we all eat. Then we have a laundry, then there's a seperate room for the ironing room. Then we got a sewing room, and that's.. Well each girl works, some of them works at the girls building, takes care of..Of course we get up and make our own bed but as far as sweeping and cleaning up the room, well the older girls takes care of that. I've worked in the dining room, I've worked in the bakery, and I've worked in the laundry and I worked in the ironing room and I worked in the kitchen room. And I even worked over there in the employees dining room as a waitress. That's where I met one old Baptist Church woman that's well know among the Kiowas. They call her Miss ah, oh what is her name? I forgot her name now. I might think about her later. She died in Hobart. She moved, she was a missionary lady used to be in Sadle Mountain Church for the longest time /, Well, we stay there all that time. We switch around every two months. Every two months they switch us around to different details. That's where I
