(What about in a situation where a man has married sisters. I think they used to do that quite a bit--)

(If these two wives of a man were sisters, how would one address the other?)

Well, they'd just be his wives. He'd say naetaesihae' w w w

(Well, would she ever just call her "sister"?)

Yeah--by the name--say "sister". If she was younger she'd say

n'ε bih'w'w -- n'ε bih'w'. -- that means she's talking to her older sister.

(Would you say that again?)

n'ε bih'w'. And then if she was talking to her younger sister she would say cett'w h w'ei

(What?)

cett'w h w'ei -- the oldest sister is talking to her younger sister.

(What does cett'w h w'ei mean?)

Well, it means "big belly."

(Why would she call her that?)

Well, that's the way--that's the way we know it. Now if I was to call my little sister I'd say "cett'w h w'ei", see? My poor Arapaho language--it's running away.

(Now would you ever call your younger sister te'siyw?)

Yeah, te'siyw If you're talking to somebody, gonna say te'siyw

Like if you said, "she said this," you would say "te'siyw said this."
