(Did you ever play horsestor anything like that?)

(What kind of games would the kids play?)

We used to have sticks. Just like we riding a horse on a stick.

Just straight straight stick and we used to pull them over and drag them. That's all we used to have.

(And then these buffalo shanks, you'd play like they were a baby, too?)
Yeah. Well, they used to play with buffalo shanks, but us, we played with cow shanks or horse. You know they always have big-where the joint it--like heads. And we used to just wrap them up with rags and play with them. That's the kind of dolls we had.

No. We used to just play and when we get through playing in the evening, gather our things and go home. And then they used to have this Ghost Dance and we used to all join in. And that's all I know. I don't know about these games. After we went to school, that's where we learn all these games. But these older people, they used to-right on the hill over there-they used to have games. I wish I had-- You know at the tip of a horn. They used to make a hole and put a stick in there, about that long. And the women used to stand in a row and they used to throw them. The one that throws hers the farthest, they used to--I don't know what they used to do. But these horns were just like snakes--they used to slide long ways.

"SNOWESNAKE" GAME PLAYED BY ADULTS

(Did you say they just used the tip of the horn?)

Yeah, they use the tip of the horn. And long stick. They used to call that wood "dogwood". Not any bigger than my finger.

(And what kind of horn would it be?)

It was cow. They used to just make them--cut them off--that tip of
