(Do the kids like that?)

Yeah, they like it. They like to scare their fathers, too. (Do the father's ever tell their kids stories or anything?) Yeah, they tell them stories.

(What about a man's father-in-law--how is he supposed to be towards his father-in-law?)

They don't talk much to their father-in-laws, but their father-in-laws always expect them to do work for them.

(What kind of work?)

Anything. Chop wood, look after horses. That's all they used to have is horses.

(Would they ever ask their son-in-law to do that, or just expect their son-in-law to do it without being asked?)

Sometimes they ask them and sometimes they just expect them to know what they're supposed to do.

(Would a father-in-law ever give presents or anything to his son-in-law?)

Oh, I don't know--I don't know whether they ever give presents to them or not.

(Would they ever tease each other or joke?)

No.

(What about if a son-in-law is around other people--would he ever talk about his father-in-law or have anything to say about him?)

No.

(About the father-in-law expecting his son-in-law to do some sort of work for him--is that just for a short time or would it be all the time--?)

It's all the time.

(What about a mother-in-law and her daughter-in-law is a daughter-in-law supposed to do anything for her mother-in-law?)
Yeah. She's supposed to cook and help her around. I thought
I done told you that. Help her around in the home.

(But a daughter and her own mother --?)

The mother does all the work.

(Then she doesn't expect her daughter to cook and things?)

No.
